How are the patient and test data collected, transmitted and utilised in the data centre?

In addition to the data usually collected in the course of patient care (surname, first name, date of birth, sex, place of residence), data on occupation, professional activity, handling of possible causes of allergy (e.g. cosmetics, medicines, paints, adhesives, etc.) as well as previous occurrence of allergic diseases ('atopy') are collected in the anamnesis ('previous history') in the course of this allergy test. These data are electronically stored and processed together with the test result and the final dermatological diagnosis in the allergy department and transmitted in pseudonymised form (omitting surname, first name, postcode, place of residence date of birth and telephone numbers) to the medical research institution together with pseudonymised data of the other patients. The purpose of this central pooling of research data is to identify allergy epidemics and their cause at an early stage, so that the responsible authorities or manufacturers can be warned if necessary.

Cryptoconcept

Both WinAlldat Net and the further processing in the ESSCA-DC are subject to strict internal requirements regarding the encryption technologies and software used. Audited open source software based on the AES algorithm is used as standard. Stronger cryptographic algorithms such as Blowfish, Twofish etc. are also available as an option.

Transparency and suitability

Due to transparency requirements and to demonstrate the appropriateness of the pseudonymised research data (i.e. surveillance data) collected in the ESSCA-DC, documents have been made available for patients and data protection officers under the following links:

Summary

Personal and test-related data are stored electronically on site using WinAlldat Net and transmitted as pseudonymised research data in the form of an encrypted AES archive to the medical research institute. The research institute has a data protection concept - Internet Security Management System consisting, among other things, of an IT guideline, crypto concept, data processing instructions, access control and firewall.

What is pseudonymised data?

Changed data protection requirements as a result of stricter legislation due to the new EU Data Protection Regulation (GDPR), which will come into force from 05/2018, required a correction and addition to the wording previously used in ESSCA-DC with regard to the surveillance data transmitted to the ESSCA-DC headquarter. The term personal data includes direct and indirect allocation of data records to natural persons. The identification of a natural person (i.e. patient) is indirectly possible via the identifiers ipatid and fallid used in WinAlldat Net via the hospital of origin, so that the data processed in ESSCA-DC are to be regarded as pseudonymised - and thus personal - data. The head office processes personal (pseudonymised) data and is consequently subject to national and General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR).

Data economy in the WinAlldat Net programme

The change in WinAlldat Net data export as of 1.11.2017 concerns the data in the data export file tblPatient.txt: as of WinAlldat Net version 2.0 R9, the age is transmitted instead of the date of birth; the patient's postcode (previously the 1st and 2nd character of the postcode) and the patient's entry date are no longer transmitted to ESSCA-DC. Patients or cases cannot be re-identified in the updated data transmission via ipatid and fallid without considerable effort. In addition, the WinAlldat Net documentation (online, Windows help file, etc.) now uses the term pseudonymised. The document Patient information on allergological diagnostics with the epicutaneous test in the version of 28.3.2013 was comprehensively revised in cooperation with the data protection officer of the University Medical Center Göttingen. Among other things, pseudonymised instead of anonymised was used in the AES-encrypted data transmission (i.e. data transfer).

Contact allergy and ESSCA

European Surveillance System on Contact Allergies (ESSCA)

Objectives

Contact allergy is a frequent condition (with up to 20% of the general population affected), and its clinical manifestation - allergic contact dermatitis (incidence approximately 7 per 1000 per year)- has considerable socioeconomic impact. Recommendations concerning primary prevention must be founded on sound scientific knowledge concerning occurrence of allergen exposures in the population. To provide such data on a European scale, ESSCA-DC, a co-ordinating data centre for the expert network ESSCA, has been conceived.

A first, technical objective is to develop Electronic Data Processing (EDP) infrastructure according to the different needs of participating departments. Once this has been achieved, the ultimate aim of ESSCA-DC can be pursued: the continuous analysis (surveillance) of pooled data for different purposes. These include internal quality control, which is both a prerequisite, and an outcome of this multicentre activity. Furthermore, inter-national comparisons which reflect the effects of a wider than strictly national allergen exposure variation, time-trend analyses, and subgroup analyses will be performed, including the possible occurrence of known allergens in new exposure contexts. These analyses, which will be duly reported not only to the scientific community, but also to (EU) regulatory institutions and - suitably prepared - to industry and to the general public, shall provide a valuable starting point for lowering the incidence of contact allergies. For industry, such analyses can serve the purpose of post marketing surveillance of product safety; thus, a considerable interest in funding ESSCA-DC beyond the initial period of three years is expected and has, indeed, been indicated at the conceptual stage already.

Scientific approach

The ESSCA-DC work plan can be divided into a technical part - an application of medical

informatics - and a scientific part. The former includes the following work packages:

- Implementation of local interfaces for export of uniformly structured data for pooled analysis in those departments which will continue to use their existing - heterogeneous - software.
- Adaptation of an existing computer program (developed for the **German network IVDK**) to ESSCA requirements, including national adaptation (e.g., translation, special test programs).
- A one-time conversion of old databases of similar scope into the newly developed structure in those departments who already used patch test software, but wanted to, or had to, switch to a system fulfilling current requirements (user-friendliness, flexibility, speed).
- Integration of the new software to be (further) developed into a hospital information system environment with very strict conformity requirements, which makes the implementation of additional database interfaces necessary
- Set up of a co-ordinating data centre

The scientific work packages include first communal analyses of pooled data (beyond a limited study context, i.e., in terms of the intended continuous surveillance), internal reporting and discussion of data during a first workshop (with two more workshops with a similar purpose scheduled in the 2nd and the 3rd year, respectively), publication of these results in peer-reviewed scientific journals, launch of an Internet site with a description of ESSCA-DC and selected results which are of public interest. The final work package is devoted to ensuring adequate funding beyond the period of 3 years contributed by the EU; interested parties have already been identified, namely manufacturers of cosmetics and household goods which often act on an international (European) scale rather than a strictly national market, and are thus interested in post marketing surveillance of product safety adapted to this market.

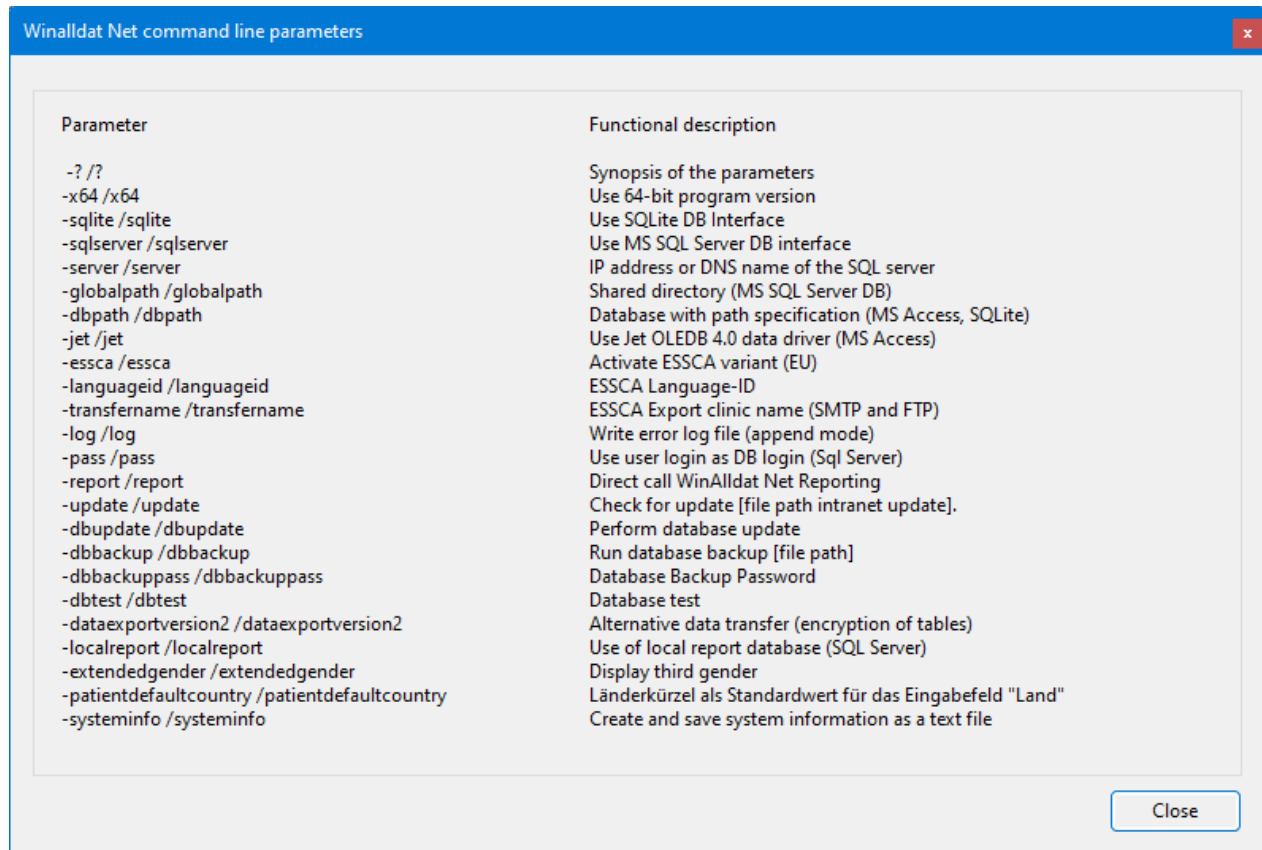
In the event of software faults, ESSCA Support offers remote maintenance via Teamviewer. In the meantime, this has proved to be a proven instrument for the quick solution of installation problems, especially in the case of complex network installations (client / server installations).

First WinAlldat Net program start

The previous password file winalldat.pwd is replaced by the new XML version WinAlldat Netpwd.ini. For encryption reasons, no settings are taken from winalldat.pwd. The programme creates the WinAlldat Net Admin account "chef" and the standard user "allergy", each with the password "ivdk". The creation of a new user (only WinAlldat Net Admin Account "chef") or the change of the password can be found (as before) under Utilities=>Access Authorisation.

Edit and update patient data

- If patient data has already been entered on the occasion of a previous consultation, but have changed (e.g., address) these can be updated at any time.
- Search for the patient record by entering the first letters of the family name in the "search patient" data field of the initial window.
- The following data are essential:
 - (Family) name, first name, birthday and sex.
- **Be very careful while changing these personal data** - do so only if you are 100% sure, that the patient you want to enter is really the patient you found in the database and that data in the database have to be corrected.
- You can either search directly for the patient (family) name, or indirectly, by entering a (sub-) string characteristic for the patient (i.e. (family) name, first name, address) in the "filter" data field and pressing the button "activate filter". In this latter case you will get a subset of all patient records complying with your search criterion in the drop down list of the patient search field.
- Other data can be omitted or filled in as applicable (e.g. birth name).
- The "internal patient ID" refers to a hospital number which might exist and which you may want to enter in the WinAlldat Net ESSCA database for later use.
- "Station" contains information on regarding the referring institution;
- The entries may be supplemented according to local interest .

Add new patient data

- This is the first step in entering the data of a person not previously registered in the database.
- Enter the first few letters of the patient's family name in the "search patient" data field of the initial screen.
- This searches the database to make sure the patient is not already contained in the database before his or her data is entered via "new patient".
- The following items are essential:
 - (Family) name, first name, birth date and sex.
- Other data can be omitted or filled in as applicable (e.g. birth name).
- The "internal patient ID" refers to a hospital number which might exist, and which you may want to enter in the WinAlldat Net ESSCA database for later use.
- "Station" contains information regarding the referring institution;
- The entries may be supplemented in the underlying database table according to local interest.

Select patient

Select a patient (i.e. case)

You can either choose a patient by their case id or by the patient's name.

The status "filtered" may appear between the case id data field and the patient list while you are searching for your patient in the patient list (the drop-down box displaying the patient's last name, first name, city, etc.).

To deactivate the filter press the button "Remove filter" at the right side of the screen in the box dedicated to the "extended search".

- The button "Remove filter" is extremely important:

If the message "filtered" appears below the top data field displaying the case number, you

must press "remove filter" to deactivate the respective filter and enable the display of all patients in the patient list and all cases (case numbers) in the list of case numbers. Otherwise you only be able to see the set of patients and case numbers allowed by the filtering criterion. Consequently, the data field for the case number will appear blocked, and will not work as it should.

In this dialogue it is possible to search for occupational titles available in the central database. In the screenshot below, various entries such as agricultural technician, dental technician, etc. are listed in the upper window after pressing the "Filter" button (alternatively via keyboard with "Alt-F"). A + sign at the beginning of an occupational title indicates a so-called upper occupational group, which represents a fuzzy data selection. For epidemiological evaluations, however, a precise (i.e. sharp and exact) occupation is necessary. Please select a precise value such as agricultural engineer and accept it by pressing the "OK" button at the bottom left of the occupation search dialogue.

Patient test series

Patient test series

- In contrast to local test series, patient-specific test series are only related to the individual case. They are therefore created in connection with the administration of the

case.

- local test series are not related to a specific case and therefore the editor for managing clinic test series is activated across cases via the menu item "Utilities", "[Test series management](#)".
- Patient-specific test blocks (case-specific test blocks of patient-specific substances and products).
- Substances or products should be entered here as precisely as possible, without restrictions regarding, for example, existing lists of (brand) names. The concentration and the vehicle should also be indicated.
- While the first text field can be used to call up an already existing test block (to change it), the second text field "Block name" is used to enter the name of a new block.
- The name is not subject to any restrictions, but should be as meaningful as possible, i.e. not "own substances", because that goes without saying, but e.g. "grinding oils from the workplace" or "paper from home", or whatever. If many substances are needed and tested, it may make sense to divide them into two or three blocks of similar substances.
- Note the special importance of the function keys F3 and F9 for searching (test) substances. For more details look here: [Keyboard Shortcuts](#)

But again, there is no real restriction. The maximum number of 99 patient blocks is sufficient.... One reason not to create too many patient blocks for a given case is that it is necessary to enter readings in each of them.

- Function/button "Select substance": for inserting substances from the central substance database into a patient-specific test block.
- Categories for classifying test blocks (e.g. for later analyses): "Contact substance" or "Test method".
- Compiling a test block should actually be easy with the help of the corresponding buttons and function keys.
- Function/button "Copy block": eases the effort when creating new blocks if only the test type changes. In addition, the typing work is reduced if, for example, a substance is to be tested in different concentrations.
- Function/button "Export block": gives you the option to export the current block as a text file.

General information regarding test series

- Test series are combinations of allergens that are treated as a single test unit.
- Either it is a list of substances used in a clinic (updated from time to time by adding new allergens, removing unnecessary ones, or changing the concentration or vehicle of allergens), or it is a list of substances (generally products that are diluted or otherwise prepared for use).
- or it is a list of substances (generally products that are appropriately diluted or otherwise prepared) that are proprietary to the patient or obtained from manufacturers.

Test series, create a test plan

- Create all necessary patient and clinic test series
- Editor for managing patient-specific test series (i.e. patient-specific substances and products)
- Test series management (editor for clinic-specific test blocks)
- First of all, you can select clinic blocks here. It is also possible to set up an individual test plan for a specific patient, or better, a specific case. (You can add or remove test blocks and change the test date for any test block.
- Before readings can be documented, all test blocks related to a specific patient/case must be ready for reaction entry, similar to the definition of the patient's own substances.
- For this purpose you can
- either transfer the desired test block from the upper window to the individual test plan in the lower window by marking the corresponding test block and then clicking on "Add

selected test block",

- or - if you know the test block number - write a list of block numbers (separated by commas) in the field "Block numbers" and then click on "Add block numbers to test plan".
- or combine both methods to complete the test plan for a specific case.
- Write the exact test date (i.e. the date when the test patch for the selected test block was applied) in the "Test date" field . Later you can also change each test date in the "Test date" column.

Remove test series from aus dem test plan

- If an incorrect test block has been selected for the test plan by mistake, select it and click on "Remove block from test plan". However, you cannot change the names of the test blocks or their test methods, as these are fixed properties.

Test block: Double testing of allergens or test substances

- After the selection of the test series (i.e. creation of a test plan), the multiple testing of test substances is indicated. An overview dialogue of the allergens concerned opens. This list can also be printed out if required

Other test and comments

Other test and comments

- Various other test results and comments regarding the current case can be entered here in plain text form.
- A statistical evaluation is only feasible to a limited extent under free text aspects.
- The text block appears in the test protocol and is mainly used to record unusual and non-standardized test methods, as well as possibly extensive findings in the area of type 1 testing (provocation test, food allergy, etc.).
- As of version R8 from May 2017, it is possible to optionally output the plain text block in the findings report. To do this, the checkbox Add plain text block to the end of the findings report (print) must be activated under options, program settings.

Reading and reactions

Reading and reactions

- Test results are entered after:
- Test series with materials brought in by the patient have been compiled and entered into the computer, see [Patient test series \(materials brought by patient\)](#), and
- the centre specific test series have been chosen for the given patient, see [Choose test series \(centre specific test series\)](#).
- In principle, both patch test results and prick, scratch and other immediate type hypersensitivity results can be recorded after the respective test series have been compiled (see [Choose test series \(centre specific test series\)](#), and after reading times and grading of reactions has been adapted in the table tblReactionCat (see [Keyboard, hints and configuration](#)).

The following description deals with patch test, the focus of ESSCA

Entering readings:

- Readings may be entered into the computer either
 - "online", i.e., with the back of the patient at the side of the screen, so to speak, or
 - "offline", with the intermediate step of noting results on a paper draft (individualised forms for this draft can be printed for this purpose) and entering them into the computer at some later time.
- In the case of "online" recording the reading time is obviously fixed, and the different test series have to be chosen and "read" for the particular reading time one after the other (the order doesn't matter, but take care not to forget one).
- In the case of "offline" recording it makes sense to choose one test series and then successively enter results for all of the applicable reading times, e.g., D2, D3, D4, before choosing the next series and proceeding in a similar fashion.

Negative results:

- Negative results do not need to be entered explicitly - every result is implicitly regarded negative if not coded otherwise.
- However, to store the information of a completely negative reading for one reading time of a series, you merely have to choose the reading time for the series and then press the "O.K." button.
- If you do not select a reading time, it will appear as if no reading was made for this series and the negative readings will not be stored!!!

Reading times:

- D1, D2, D3, D4, D5, D6 and D7 are integrated as fixed reading times.
- Additionally, one late reading may be recorded choosing the reading time "late" and specifying the day of the late reading in a special separate data field.

Allergens "not tested":

- Those test substances not tested individually because, e.g., of known sensitisation, temporary non-availability, have to be marked with "N.T." (not tested) during the first reading, because otherwise they would be counted as "negative". Negative reactions do not have to be entered, but are considered automatically.

- After completion of the patch test procedure, the final diagnoses and other important information are documented. This includes a statement on the clinical relevance of every positive (allergic) reaction.
- Statements on the clinical relevance contain important information and are an essential aspect of a qualified diagnostic work-up.
- In addition to the required common temporal classifications, i.e. current and past, additional dimensions regarding occupational relevancy and the degree of certainty of the statement can be optionally recorded and are highly recommended.
- The required "must" section offers statements for:
 - "current relevance",
 - "past relevance",
 - "unknown relevance",
 - "cross reaction",
 - and "active sensitisation"
- The optional categorization of "occupational" vs. "non-occupational" is strongly encouraged.
- It is also possible to select the degree of certainty of the relevance statement from the third level of the selection tree.
This optional tree level includes the categories:
 - "certain"(100% certain),
 - "probable"(more than 50% certain),
 - "possible"(less than 50% certain),
 - and "unlikely, not"

be kept with the patient's medical records. The page header can be customised in the pull down menu "Extras, Options, Printing header", see [Printing header](#).

- You can also export essential test protocols to an export file ([Export to text file](#)). You can make adjustments to the export function under the menu topic "Extras, Options, Other options", see [Extras/options](#).

Test protocol:

- After all readings (results) have been entered, a test protocol can be printed.
- The test protocol is a printout of all the tested series and their respective readings. The series are printed in order of their test series number, with materials brought in by the patient printed last. This protocol can be kept with the patient's medical records.
- The test protocol will also be printed in the background as an XML file. The XML file contains the current test protocol and resides in the subdirectory "XML". In combination with an XSL-file it produces an HTML version of the test protocol.

Final diagnosis:

- The final diagnosis printout is an abridged version of the Test protocol . Only the names of the test series tested and the substances with positive reactions are included in this printout. In the case of patch test results relevance data will be printed too.

Relevance form:

- The relevance form is a printout of all positive results of tested substances entered for the case can be printed in a structured way.
- This form can be used for offline documentation of relevance information that will be entered into the computer at some later stage.

Test series administration

Test series administration

This menu item enables the addition of new and the modification of existing clinic test series (synonym: clinic blocks). The work required for this is carried out with the help of the drop-down menu "Utilities", Test series administration".

- Clinic blocks: are all test series that are not only tested on a single, specific patient. The test type (epicutaneous, rubbing, prick test) can be determined here, test substances can be added or deleted. The concentration, the vehicle and the manufacturer can be changed.
- Function/button "Copy block": eases the effort when creating new blocks if only the test type changes. In addition, the paperwork is reduced if, for example, a substance is to be tested in different concentrations.
- Function/button "Export block": gives you the option of exporting the current block to a text file for further processing.

- Be careful not to change an existing test block, i.e. create a new version of it, as long as it is still being used, i.e. tested on any patients, and the relevant results are not yet stored in the database.
- If a test block is changed, which may be necessary from time to time to add new substances, remove substances, change the concentration, the vehicle or the manufacturer of an allergen, the old version will only be available for "old" cases but not for reading current or future cases.
- Therefore, enter all data obtained with a particular test block before changing it.
- Test blocks can be used for tests as long as they are valid. After a test block has been modified or deleted, no new tests can be performed with this block. Tests that have been

started can be terminated (e.g. you have tested a block after 24h and then changed it. You can then enter the values for the later reading, e.g. 48h, but it is not possible to create a new patient with the old block).

- The test results are all kept historically correct, so that changing a block does not affect old results; they are always printed correctly in the test protocol or analysed correctly in the reports on the test results.
- Great care should be taken when searching the database for substance names. Synonyms and spelling variants must be taken into account, as multiple entries for the same substance should be avoided.
- Data that can be entered for a test substance:
- Substance - i.e. name of allergen, concentration (%), test vehicle (AQU, VAS, etc.), manufacturer of test substance (NN=No information).

Search the substance list carefully for substances already stored in the database before adding a new substance name!

- Searching the database for substance names must be done with special care. Synonyms and spelling variants must be considered to avoid multiple entries of a certain substance. Enter some letters of the (test) substance in the test substance selection list (dropdown) and select the appropriate substance.
- Note the special importance of the function keys F9 for searching (test) substances. s. Keyboard
- If you do not find the appropriate allergen, please select the 1st element ((new substance)) in the test substance selection list (dropdown) or press the F3 function key to open the dialogue for creating a substance. In the case of cosmetics, it is also possible to enter the INCI name.
- Alternatively, you can activate a test substance search with the button Search test substance (bottom right in the dialogue) or F9. This dialogue also allows the creation of a new test substance in case the search and filtering for a substance name was unsuccessful.

Administrative functions: List of test substances and test series:

- Under the menu item Utilities, Test substance list Test series, Test substance list with filter, Test series overview are available. You can print out the list of (filtered) test substances or test series and make it available to the staff as a working aid. The test substance list provides information on the concentration, the vehicle, the block number and the position of a substance within the test series in which it occurs.

Delete current case

Deleting a case should be done carefully

- There is no undo function available, so that the case data and all test data are actually lost.
- If the patient has only one case, the patient master data (name, birthday, sex, address, etc.) will also be deleted automatically.
- To preserve the patient master data:
- Before deleting a case, create a new (dummy) case with the function or the button [new case](#).
- Then select the case number to be deleted again. Only the case and test data will now be removed.

- A list of all test substances currently used in the test series, indicating block no. and position, is displayed. If necessary, the list of test substances and allergens can be narrowed down by a filter (e.g. by a substring such as 'methy' in the screenshot).
- The sort order can be changed by double-clicking on the column headings. This function is useful when planning new test series and creating new test substances (see [test series management](#)) to avoid test substance duplicates.
- **If required, this test substance list can be printed out or exported as an HTML file by double-clicking with the mouse.** Keep in mind that if you have many test blocks, the list with all test substances may generate many printed pages! Therefore, if necessary, only print the required pages (setting in the Windows print dialogue PAGE FROM - TO).

Only experienced users - e.g. the local database administrator in conjunction with the senior physician of the allergy department - should use this function. Positive substances of these now activated test types (= empty row/entry) are from now on displayed in the evaluation (=relevance) dialogue, so that a relevance evaluation is possible. Please keep in mind that this only makes sense with epicutaneous or near-epicutaneous test types. Avoid false relationships between relevance and test types, e.g. to type-1 test types such as intracutaneous or prick. Otherwise, you will store nonsensical data in the database, which may lead to erroneous data in statistical evaluations and therefore possibly to erroneous publications.

With the help of self-defined additional questions, you can describe the clinical picture of a patient even more precisely.

- Under the menu item *administration tools* => *additional questions* you can define additional questions which can then be used in the [anamnesis](#) with the characteristics you have defined.
- **You can only use those additional questions for a patient or case which you have created before the patient regarding the examination date.** Example: If you have defined a supplementary question on 23.02.2000, you cannot use it with a patient case whom you have already created with the examination date 22.02.2000

FAQs

Program Updates

Please read the following information before installing the program. The program updates will not affect previously entered cases or readings. Please execute the program updates immediately upon receipt.

Export of Partially Anonymous Data

The partially anonymous data is often confused with the back-up diskette required to repair the database in an emergency. The data export merely extracts general data regarding patient anamnesis, tests, readings, reactions and relevance to be sent to the ESSCA-DC for analysis. Patients' personal data are not included due to privacy protection reasons.

Database Backup

The backup saves of the data (including personal patient information) in the database on a floppy disk (or other suitable media, i.e. ZIP-disk) and serves as a local "Backup Copy", that can be used to repair the database in the case of an emergency (damage to your computer). The data is password protected, to prevent its misuse.

To ensure data protection, a back-up should only be sent to the technical support in extreme emergencies (e.g. a defective hard-drive) or special situations, (e.g. to facilitate a new installation).

Department Test Series and Tests of Patient's Own Substances

Each department has their own test series (Series Numbers 401 to 899), which may serve to supplement an existing DKG-test series or to test a specific type of allergen. These test series are entered and updated on-site by the your own department. Tests of materials supplied by the patients themselves (Series Numbers 900 to 999), i.e. cosmetics, occupational materials or gloves, must be entered for each individual patient and are only good for this patient. Statistical analysis of these unique tests series are – in contrast to the department test series - very difficult, and therefore nearly impossible to implement.

Defining New Substances

Department test series can be entered in the "Utilities?" menu (menu option: "Test Series Administration") of the main WinAlldat/ESSCA program. New substances can be entered while editing a test series by entering the substance name into the appropriate test series row, whereupon program will search for a matching substance. If no match is found in the existing substance catalog, a new substance can be entered. In order to enter a new substance, scroll to the very top of the selection window or typing the first two characters of the phrase "((New substance))", in other words the two open parentheses. Clicking on this text opens the window for entering a new substance, which will be permanently stored in the central substance database.

Tip: By double-clicking with the mouse, internal lists can be exported as HTML files (quick export function) for further processing in Word, Excel etc.

The keyboard layout corresponds as far as possible to the Windows standard.
